

## Official Development Assistance to end violence against children



ODA to end violence against children is less than 0.6% of global ODA (less than US\$1.1 billion out of US\$174 billion)

In the 107 recipient countries of ODA for ending violence against children, the average investment per child is around **US\$0.65** a year






